The provisions in the Instructions to Bidders and in the General Conditions of Contract contained in the bidding documents comply with the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Act [Chapter 22:23]. The Procurement method applicable for the bidding process shall be National Competitive Bidding. **Prospective Bidders must be registered with the Procurement Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe (PRAZ).**

The opportunity for Donnington project is open to Zimbabwean companies only. Bidders are required to pay an administration fee payable by Bidders of **US\$100.00** to the Procurement Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe. The payments are in line with Section 54 of the Act as set out in Part IV of the Fifth Schedule to the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Regulations (SI 5 of 2018).

Bidding Documents will be available electronically upon a written request to procurement@idbz.co.zw. Bids shall be valid for a bid period of 120 days.

Bids must be submitted in a sealed envelope and deposited in the tender box located at the address mentioned above and shall be endorsed on the outside with the advertised tender number, description and closing date.

Bids should be priced in United States Dollars (USD). The currency of evaluation will be United States Dollars. Bids in other currencies will be converted to this currency for evaluation purposes only, using the exchange rates published by the Reserve Bank of Zimbabwe on the date of the submission deadline, see http://www.rbz.co.zw/. Quotations shall be in USD with the understanding that the actual payment will be in RTGS dollars/ local currency at the applicable interbank exchange rate (the going rate).

No faxed, e-mailed or late tenders will be considered. The IDBZ is not obliged to accept the lowest bid, or any bid. Bids will be opened in the presence of bidder's representatives who choose to attend at 10:00hours local time (Central African Time) on or before submission deadline date, at the above stated offices.

All bidders are invited to the opening of tenders immediately after closing on the stipulated dates and times for the respective tenders of Donnington and Westbourne projects. Attendance to the closing and opening is not compulsory, and any member of the public may attend at their own free will.
